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Cameron Fowler was appointed Executive Vice-President, Personal and Commercial Banking Canada in July 2010. Prior to Barclays, he was with Delano Technology Corporation from 1999 to 2003, ultimately serving as General Manager for Europe, Middle East and Africa. Mr. Fowler has also worked for Braxton Associates/Deloitte Consulting and served as Policy Advisor for the Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs, Government of Ontario.

Mr. Fowler is a member of the Board of Directors of Moneris Solutions. He is Chair of the Advisory Council for the Greening Canada Fund, a non-profit corporation and the first voluntary carbon emissions reduction fund aimed exclusively at large Canadian corporations. Mr Fowler is a member of the Greening Greater Toronto Task Force, and is active in several local and international charities including United Way.
